

Recommended Skills for Kindergarten Readiness

Children <u>entering</u> kindergarten have an advantage when they begin school if they are able to do some of the following:

Reading and Language Arts

- Recognize and write own first name
 (NOTE: Student name should begin with a capital letter and all other letters should be written in lowercase, such as John.)
- Name some letters, especially the letters in his/her name
- Distinguish the difference between numbers and letters
- Recite simple, rhyming poems such as nursery rhymes
- Identify colors (red, blue, yellow, green, orange, purple, black, brown, white, pink, grey)
- Sort and classify pictures and objects by one characteristic (such as: "These are all buttons."
 and "These are all pictures of horses.)

Math



- Count to ten
- Recognize the written numbers 0 10
- Verbally count up to ten objects. First touch then count the object ("One, two, three, etc.)
- Understand concept of left and right

Fine Motor



- Hold scissors correctly (Thumb in small hole in handle and first two digits in large hole of the handle)
- Cut a line
- Hold pencils correctly (see diagram)
- Button and zip articles of clothing

Social



- Sit quietly and attend to a single task for five minutes
- Act in a socially responsible way even when an adult is not around to monitor his/her behavior

Self Help Skills



• Totally care for toileting needs including flushing toilet and washing and drying their hands
