- A minimum 10% point growth to meet "Safe Harbor" will be achieved in the 2013 California Standards Test (CST) English-Language Arts & Mathematics subject tests for the following specific student subgroups:
 - ☐ African American Hispanic Latino Students with Disabilities Socioeconomically Disadvantaged English Language Learners
- All other district subgroups will maintain high levels of proficiency and continue to advance to the state target (89.0% English-Language Arts; 89.1% Mathematics).
- At least 57.5% of all English Language Learners will move one EL proficiency level for every year of instruction.
- High schools will increase their 2013 four-year graduation rates and CAHSEE passage by 3%.
