INTRODUCTION TO THE SUBJECT:

Reading is a course open to students in grade 9 through 12 who are reading at various levels. The course is designed to meet each student's individual needs through pre-testing, diagnosis, prescription, and post-testing. Emphasis is placed upon development of vocabulary, comprehension, and rate.
